


# FWW CIRCLE

As the only PATH Premier accredited center in the Northland and Kansas City area, NTRC will meet the growing demand for therapeutic services with plans for exciting capital improvements to support our long-term growth and sustainability. It's why we're taking the reins on the Full Circle Campaign, a community endeavor to transform today's dreams into realities!



Equine assisted therapies and activities are life-changing for individuals who live with a diverse range of abilities and conditions such as Cerebral Palsy, Autism, Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder, Traumatic Brain Injury, and Down Syndrome.

Our PATH certified instructors and dedicated volunteers at NTRC assist more than 100 students in experiencing limitless benefits to their social, emotional, and physical well-being.

The Full Circle Campaign will allow NTRC to:

- Construct a 3,360 square foot Education & Community Center facility for therapy participants, families, and surrounding communities - a space for educational programs, social interaction, and access to resources.
- Provide access to more individuals who need therapeutic services, ensuring a welcoming and inclusive place for students and families to be involved, accepted, and supported.
- Provide accessible community rooms and administrative areas to support our professional work such as student rider evaluations and therapeutic plans.
- Complete our current barn enclosure project which will allow for year-round programming. This consistency is critical to our students' mental, physical and emotional health.

# Building for the

The newly constructed facility will provide private spaces for family meetings and student rider evaluations; classrooms for rider, parent, and community education opportunities; gathering space for social and community events; and professional areas for credentialed and administrative staff and volunteers.

Additionally, the barn at the riding center is being improved with an enclosure to provide protection from the elements, allowing our riders to improve and grow year-round. Funding from the campaign will complete this final phase of center improvements.





The J.E. and L.E. Mabee Foundation has presented an extraordinary opportunity to our community: a grant award of \$215,000 will be gifted to Northland Therapeutic Riding Center, to help us to reach our fundraising goal for the new education and community center.

To receive the award, NTRC must raise \$217,630 by January 10, 2024. This award, along with current fundraising efforts, will get us to \$721,630 for this new facility. Additional funds raised will go to the completion of our barn enclosure project and other equipment needs.
